NOTES on Coachwork	Coachwork is generally termed as follows:- 2 Seater (<i>Two seats with soft top</i>), 2 Seater with Dickey, Tourer (<i>Four seats with soft top</i>), 2 Door Saloon fixed head, 2 Door Saloon sliding head, 4 Door Saloon fixed head, 4 Door Saloon sliding head, Coupé, Sports or Special Coupé & Travellers Saloon. (SLIDING HEAD means sunshine roof in modern parlance)										
NOTES on Model Year	Generally, Morris Motors introduced their new models at the Motor Show in October. For example:- the 1934 models were shown in October 1933, and if you took delivery of a new car in, say, November it would be manufactured and registered in 1933, but would be a 1934 model.
